Another artistic element of the event is the inclusion of a unique piece of art inspired by the new series and designed by visual artist, Jameson Donoian, which will be raffled off to raise funds for A4AC. Jameson has been teaching a visual arts class at the Boys and Girls Clubs of Martin County as part of A4AC Therapeutic Arts Program with the goal of creating a safe environment for artistic expression that can help lead to academic and behavioral improvements in at-risk youth. Jameson will speak briefly about some of the triumphs this program has already witnessed which have led to the Boys and Girls Club tapping A4AC as their official provider of visual and performing arts outreach at all Martin County clubs.
