



rtists for a Cause has been asked to provide "Therapeutic Arts" to the children with special needs at Challenger School, as well as for children with disabilities at ARC, Helping People Succeed, Arts for Autism and more.

Starting this fall, the program will offer a therapeutic watercolor class, taught by an instructor with an advanced degree in the fine arts and a minor in psychology, as well as regular sessions with a certified music therapist. We are so pleased to be able to offer this support where it's needed most. Once again, art can be the solution.

Measurable outcomes of the curriculum will include work on cognitive and auditory processing and other sensory-motor, perceptual/motor, gross and fine motor skills, planning, sequencing, organization, attention span, problem solving, flexibility, socialization, impulse control and more.

Also, many of you participated in Therapeutic Music Day in the past. We are expanding this program, making it easier for you to participate and find the support that you need. The program is now being called "Therapeutic Arts" and will include opportunities for all performing artists and some visual arts educators interested in serving the elderly and at-risk youths.

Whether you'd like to volunteer to share your talents, you're a professional seeking to be paid to participate, or you're an educator seeking opportunity for your students, we'd like to hear from you.

Facilities that serve the elderly and at-risk youth are invited to contact us as well. You are eligible for service once, on special event days, or even at a regular interval throughout the year.

Artists for a Cause is a Florida-based, national not-for-profit organization that improves communities using art as a catalyst to achieve incredible results. Some programs help artists and charities get the most out of their collaboration, while others produce results directly, by feeding the poor, healing the sick, or solving other problems through unique artistic solutions.


